<a href="https://www.w3.org/WAI/standards-guidelines/wcag/">https://www.w3.org/WAI/standards-guidelines/wcag/</a>	<p>Web Content Accessibility Guidelines (WCAG) is developed through the <a href="#">W3C process</a> in cooperation with individuals and organizations around the world, with a goal of providing a single shared standard for web content accessibility that meets the needs of individuals, organizations, and governments internationally.</p> <p>The WCAG documents explain how to make web content more accessible to people with disabilities. Web "content" generally refers to the information in a web page or web application, including:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• natural information such as text, images, and sounds</li><li>• code or markup that defines structure, presentation, etc.</li></ul>
